Remedial Reading and Remedial Language Arts, Grades 1-12 (#102) Cross-Endorsement

In order to be eligible for the #102 endorsement, Connecticut regulations require the completion of an approved planned program of preparation in remedial reading, leading to an institutional recommendation. For a list of approved programs in Connecticut, please refer to the <u>"Guide to Approved Educator Preparation Programs in Connecticut."</u>

Requirements for this endorsement include:

- completion of a state-approved program specific to remedial reading and remedial language arts, leading to formal institutional recommendation on Connecticut's Statement of Preparing Higher Education Institution (form <u>ED 170A</u>);
- completion of at least 30 school months of successful, appropriate classroom teaching experience; and
- passing score on the Pearson Reading Specialist Test <u>#008</u> (prior to August 19, 2024) or <u>#802</u> (as of August 19, 2024).

Please be aware that planned programs in Literacy or Reading (as opposed to Remedial Reading) may not meet requirements for this endorsement. In addition, the Connecticut State Department of Education is not able to formally approve any out-of-state programs. However, educators who have completed literacy or reading programs that included such coursework as follows may apply and be reviewed for eligibility:

- Developmental reading;
- Reading in content areas;
- Diagnosis and remediation of reading and language arts difficulties;
- Clinical practices in reading and language arts (at least 6 credits);
- Language arts; and
- Tests and measurements.

NOTE: All coursework must result in the award of college-level credit posted to an official transcript from a regionally accredited college or university.

- Institutional recommendation based on completion of a state-approved certification program specific to special service in remedial reading and language arts, including at least 12 semester hours of graduate credit with coursework in each of the following areas:
 - Advanced Reading and Language Arts Diagnosis;
 - o Organization, Administration and Supervision of Reading and Language Arts Programs;
 - Practicum in Consulting, including applied research, of at least six semester hours' credit in total;
- Ten school months as a remedial reading and remedial language arts teacher; and

A course of study in special education comprised of not fewer than 36 clock hours, which shall include study in understanding the growth and development of exceptional children, including handicapped and gifted and talented children and children who may require special education, and methods for identifying, planning for and working effectively with special-needs children in the regular classroom.
